- To listen attentively and respond to what they hear with relevant comments and actions when being read to and during whole class and small group discussions.

- To prepare their social and emotional abilities ahead of starting Year I through asking questions and being involved with transition activities.
- To set and work towards simple goals, being able to wait for what they want.

- To use oil paints and experiment with different brush strokes.

- To move expressively to a beat.



Understanding the World

- To sequence the life cycle of a sunflower, bee, frog, and butterfly.
- To plant and care for flowers.
- To research and find out about the work of the scientist Jane Goodall.
- To describe the features of a beach.
- To compare the seaside from the past to the present.

Mathematics

- To count and explore number to 20 and beyond.
- To manipulate, compose and decompose shapes (2D and 3D).
- To define sharing and grouping in relation to number and its links to doubling and even and odd numbers.
- To explore pattern, positions, and maps.
- To secure understanding of number tracks and number lines and how to use them to find more and less of a given number.

Literacy

- To write phrases, captions and sentences that can be read by themselves and others.
- To read over their writing and make any changes that are needed.
- To read aloud books that are consistent with Phase 3-5 Phonics level.
- To discuss vocabulary that are in fiction, non-fiction books and poems.

Termly plans provide starting points for learning and link to an overall theme. The open-ended questions, visits and interviews stimulate children's lines of enquiry, conversations and interests which can then be used to focus learning each week.
