A message from our Chair of Governors ...

Governors met earlier this term for the first full meeting of the new academic year. A chance to reflect on the previous year including the fantastic OFSTED report, and to unpick results, as well as plan the year ahead. In particular the parents survey with so many positive comments was a pleasure to read. There were constructive suggestions including many parents who clearly want to see more of their children's time in school. In response to this, sessions are already being planned for the year ahead to involve parents. Our school has such a wealth of experiences and activities to offer pupils, from farm visits and swimming to forest school and residentials, that governors feel the school needs to promote itself more widely. We will be looking to form a group of interested governors, staff and parents to help with this, keep an eye on the newsletter if you are interested in getting involved.

Governors meet in full once a term and committees meet either termly or half termly. All governors bring with them varied skills and backgrounds and is this that makes a good governing board.
